

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

August 8, 2017 Council Meeting

Council has directed Administration to advertise the disposal of the Seniors Van in the newspaper and social media indicating that the County will consider written proposals from organizations that would use the van to offer services to the County residents. Watch for information on this coming soon!

Council has approved the disposal of Unit #32032 a 1998 14' Pony Pup Gravel Trailer to an upcoming Ritchie Bros. auction, as per Policy 1.2 Disposal of Surplus Items.

Council directed Administration to attend the Intermunicipal Development Plan meeting with the Town of Peace River on August 11, 2017 and to provide Council with additional information at an upcoming Council meeting.

Council has directed Administration to respond to a concerned resident on Range Road 213 and to provide the resident with contact information for Alberta Health Services and Alberta Environment and Parks.

Council has appointed Bob Madore as the Acting Chief Administrative Officer of Northern Sunrise County effective July 28, 2017.

Council directed Administration to provide a letter of support for Daishowa-Marubeni International Ltd., Peace River Pulp Division for their re-certification audit.

Council will be sending a letter of support to the Mackenzie Municipal Services Agency for their Land Use Planning Municipal Internship application.

Council directed Administration to advise the Water North Coalition that the County is in agreement with the implementation of a \$100 annual membership fee for voting members.

Council directed Administration to send a letter to the North Peace Housing Foundation requesting that they respond to the questions raised from the Friends of Berwyn Autumn Lodge, as well as the concerns identified in the letter from the Municipal District of Peace No. 132 dated July 31, 2017 and that the response be sent to all of the municipalities within the North Peace Housing Foundation.

Council directed Administration to begin advertising for the position of Chief Administrative Officer; and to provide Council with a listing of possible executive recruitment firms that could be used to conduct the search.

Council directed Administration to draft a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the future operations of the Nampa Museum to present to Council at the August 22, 2017 Council meeting.
