

# COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

## August 22, 2017 Council Meeting

Council has directed Administration to update the Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) with the Town of Peace River.

Council has directed Administration to delay the application of oil stabilized gravel on Township Road 810 west of Highway 2 until 2018 so that the project will not conflict with the fall farming operations in the area.

Council has directed Administration to arrange for the dedication of the benches for former Councillor Paul Belzile and former Councillor Ricky Boucher.

Council directed Administration to provide an update on the 2017 drainage projects to a future Council meeting and to include the update on the County's website.

Council has directed Administration to send correspondence to the Lubicon Lake Band in response to their request dated August 14, 2017 regarding the redistricting application submitted on June 15, 2017.

### Bylaws:

- ⇒ Council has given first reading to Bylaw B318/17 for the purpose of redistricting approximately 2.3 acres within NW-11-86-14-W5M from Forestry District (F) to Little Buffalo District (LB). A Public Hearing has been scheduled for September 12, 2017 at 10:30 a.m.
- ⇒ Council has referred Bylaw B317/17 for the purpose of amending Bylaw B275/15 for the purpose of updating definitions and add Occupation, Home II as a discretionary use in the residential hamlet districts (HR and HMHR) and Agricultural Intensive as a discretionary use in the Rural Settlement District (RS) to Administration to review the term Agricultural Intensive.

Council directed Administration to investigate the slide area at NE-32-83-21-W5M and to bring a report back to a future Council meeting.

Council has forgiven the 2017 taxes levied on Tax Rolls 155885, 230476, 230477, 230478, 230479, and 313309 in the amount of \$47.67 as they are in the process of being transferred to County leases.

Council directed Administration to send a letter to Municipal Affairs in support of payment of school tax and seniors housing requisitions on delinquent accounts from oil and gas companies.

### Presentations:

- ⇒ Dino Colbourne, Nicholas Gafuik, Steve Lepp, Randy Stamp, and Jenna Strachan with Canadian Natural Resources Ltd. provided Council with an update on their operations overall as well as specific operations within the County.

Council directed Administration to investigate the condition of Township Road 842 west of highway 688, and bring a report back to a future Council meeting.

Council directed Administration to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the County, the Village of Nampa, and the Nampa & District Historical Society regarding the operations of the Nampa Museum.
